In the past, there has been a reluctance to participate because the Team was unsure of where the funds would go, how they would be used and how to approach the classmates to contribute, since our funds are limited. However, we were recently approached by Jim Leis of the Class of 1965 and asked to think about contributing to the Maine West Scholarship Fund. The following is an excerpt from an email that I received from Jim:

"The fund was created last year by some '65'ers wanting to give a gift to the school. We raised money among ourselves and enlisted the assistance of other classes holding reunions. On May 19th, we will be awarding three grants to students in need to continue their education. The three are: \$610, honoring the class of '61, \$650 honoring the class of '65 and \$660 honoring the class of '66. We are working with the class of '67 as they prepare for their 50th in September, hoping they will raise money and help fund a scholarship honoring their class."

Jim Leis will actually be present on the night of our Ice Breaker, September 14, 2018 at Gino's East in order to take any contributions that will be given in the name of the Class of 1968. Since the awards will be given in May, our contributions will be used to benefit a student or students in the following school term.
