To say we had 'the best summers ever' is an understatement. We had a ball and fantastic memories to prove it!

The days were all an adventure and we were never, ever, bored. Our imaginations took us everywhere. We made up games, we played with everyone in the neighborhood, and no one was left out. Each morning everyone would get together and decide what we would do that day.

In the early years, we would stick around the neighborhood. There was always something to do. We'd ride bikes, run through the sprinkler, play hopscotch and other games with chalk and rocks, play tag, Statue Maker, baseball, kickball, wading pools, squirt guns, exchange trading cards, throw a blanket on the ground and eat lunch outside, lay on the grass and see what we saw in the clouds, play school or store (each house was a different store...bakery, meat market, etc.), we'd put on fantastic plays and charge 2 cents to see it, we'd help in the garden, drink from the garden hose, the activities went on and on.

As we got older, we started going uptown. We'd spend hours going from Woolworth's, Speiglers, the music stores, and toy stores, browsing everywhere, and we were welcomed by all. The patrons knew us, they knew our families. We'd end up at the Sugar Bowl for sundaes, fries, and a Green River. Or we'd go to the Des Plaines Theater, if it was especially hot, as they had air conditioning.

Rand Park became the hangout as we entered 'older' years. So many memories and stories.
