The following is an excerpt from an E-Mail that I received from Jim:

On May 19th, we will be awarding three grants to students in need to continue their education. The three are: \$610, honoring the class of '61, \$650 honoring the class of '65 and \$660 honoring the class of '66. We are working with the class of '67 as they prepare for their 50th in September, hoping they will raise money and help fund a scholarship honoring their class."
